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## Part IV—Section 2

### Tamil Nadu Acts and Ordinances

The following Act of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly received the assent of the President on the 19th July 1994 and is hereby published for general information :—

ACT No. 45 OF 1994.

*An Act to provide for reservation of seats in educational institutions in the State and of appointments or posts in the services under the State for the Backward Classes of citizens and for persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes in the State of Tamil Nadu.*

WHEREAS the policy of reservation for the social, economic and educational advancement of the people belonging to Backward Classes of citizens in admissions to educational institutions in the State and for appointments in the services under the State has been under implementation in the State of Tamil Nadu for a long time ;

AND WHEREAS the State of Tamil Nadu is a pioneer State in providing reservation for the underprivileged and the first communal Government Order was passed in the year 1921 and the proportional representation for communities was made in the year 1927 in the State of Tamil Nadu ;

AND WHEREAS a large percentage of population of Tamil Nadu suffering from social and educational backwardness for many years have started enjoying the fruits of the reservation policy and have been able to improve their lot and attain a higher standard of living ;

AND WHEREAS clause (4) of Article 15 of the Constitution enables the State to make any special provision for the advancement of any socially and educationally Backward Classes of citizens or for the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes ;

AND WHEREAS clause (4) of Article 16 of the Constitution enables the State to make any provision for the reservation of appointments or posts in favour of any Backward Class of citizens which, in the opinion of the State, is not adequately represented in the services under the State ;

AND WHEREAS under clause (1) of Article 38 of the Constitution, the State shall strive to promote the welfare of the people by securing and protecting as effectively as it may, a social order in which justice, social, economic and political, shall inform all the institutions of the national life ;

AND WHEREAS under clause (2) of Article 38 of the Constitution, the State shall, in particular, strive to minimise the inequalities in income and endeavour to eliminate inequalities in status, facilities and opportunities, not only amongst individuals but also amongst groups of people residing in different areas or engaged in different vocations ;

AND WHEREAS under clause (b) of Article 39 of the Constitution, the State shall, in particular, direct its policy towards securing that the ownership and control of the material resources of the community are so distributed as best to subserve the common good ;

AND WHEREAS under clause (c) of Article 39 of the Constitution, the State shall in particular, direct its policy towards securing that the operation of the economic system does not result in the concentration of wealth and means of production to the common detriment ;

AND WHEREAS under Article 46 of the Constitution, the State shall promote, with special care, the educational and economic interests of the weaker sections of the people, and, in particular, of the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, and shall protect them from social injustice and all forms of exploitation ;

AND WHEREAS the representatives of the various political parties and social forums representing backward classes have requested the State Government to consider all the ramifications of the Supreme Court judgment, dated the 16th day of November 1992 in *Indra Sawhney Vs. Union of India* (AIR. 1993 SC 477) regarding reservations under clause (4) of Article 16 of the Constitution and take steps to protect their interests adequately ;

AND WHEREAS in the opinion of the State Government, Backward Classes of citizens, and the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, who constitute the majority of the total population of the State are not adequately represented in the services under the State in proportion to their population in the State of Tamil Nadu ;

AND WHEREAS the State Government have, after careful consideration, taken a policy decision that the existing level of sixty-nine per cent reservation in admission to educational institutions in the State and in the services under the State, for the Backward Classes of citizens and for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, should be continued for ensuring the advancement of the majority of the people of the State of Tamil Nadu ;

BE it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Tamil Nadu in the Forty-fourth Year of the Republic of India as follows :—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Tamil Nadu Backward Classes, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Reservation of seats in Educational Institutions and of appointments or posts in the Services under the State) Act, 1993.

(2) It extends to the whole of the State of Tamil Nadu.

(3) (a) Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 8 shall be deemed to have come into force on the 16th day of November 1992.

(b) Section 7 shall be deemed to have come into force on the 15th day of March 1993.

duration.

2. It is hereby declared that this Act is for giving effect to the policy of the State towards securing the principles laid down in Part IV and in particular, in Article 38, clauses (b) and (c) of Article 39 and Article 46 of the Constitution.

definitions.

3. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

(a) "Backward Classes of citizens" means the class or classes of citizens who are socially and educationally backward, as may be notified by the Government in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette*, and includes the Most Backward Classes and the Denotified Communities ;

(b) "educational institution" means—

(i) any college or other educational institution, maintained by the State, or receiving aid out of the State funds, or affiliated to any university established by law including an university college and a constituent college; or

(ii) any institute or training centre recognised or approved by the Government,

with the object of preparing, training or guiding its students for any certificate, degree or diploma or other academic distinctions granted or conferred by any University, or authority established or approved in this behalf by the Government;

(c) "Government" means the State Government;

(d) "Scheduled Castes" shall have the same meaning as in the Constitution;

(e) "Scheduled Tribes" shall have the same meaning as in the Constitution.

4. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any judgment, decree or order of any court or other authority, having regard to the social and educational backwardness of the Backward Classes of citizens and the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes who constitute the majority of the total population of the State of Tamil Nadu, the reservation in respect of the annual permitted strength in each branch or faculty for admission into educational institutions in the State, for the Backward Classes of citizens and for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, shall be sixty-nine per cent.

(2) The reservation referred to in sub-section (1) shall, in respect of the persons belonging to the Backward Classes, the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities, the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, be as hereunder:—

(a) Backward Classes .. .. . Thirty per cent.

(b) Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities. Twenty per cent.

(c) Scheduled Castes .. .. . Eighteen per cent.

(d) Scheduled Tribes .. .. . One per cent.

5. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in any judgment, decree or order of any court or other authority, having regard to the inadequate representation in the services under the State, of the Backward Classes of citizens and the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, who constitute the majority of the total population of the State of Tamil Nadu, the reservation for appointments or posts in the services under the State, for the Backward Classes of citizens and for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, shall be sixty-nine per cent.

*Explanation.*—For the purposes of this Act, "services under the State" includes the services under—

(i) the Government;

(ii) the Legislature of the State;

(iii) any local authority;

(iv) any corporation or company owned or controlled by the Government; or

(v) any other authority in respect of which the State Legislature has power to make laws.

(2) The reservation referred to in sub-section (1) shall, in respect of the persons belonging to the Backward Classes, the Most Backward Classes and Denotified Communities, the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, be as hereunder :—

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in sections 4 and 5, the claims of the students or members belonging to the Backward Classes of citizens or the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes, shall also be considered for the unreserved seats, appointments or posts which shall be filled on the basis of merit and where a student or member belonging to the Backward Classes of citizens or the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes, is selected on the basis of merit, the number of seats, appointments or posts reserved for the Backward Classes of citizens or for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes or the Scheduled Tribes, as the case may be, shall not in any way be affected.

7. The Government may, from time to time, based on the reports presented at the appropriate periods to the Government by the Tamil Nadu Backward Classes Commission constituted in G.O. Ms. No. 9, Backward Classes and Most Backward Classes Welfare Department, dated the 15th day of March 1993, by notification, classify or sub-classify the Backward Classes of citizens for the purposes of this Act.

8. (1) The Government may make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.

(2) (a) All rules made under this Act shall be published in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette* and unless they are expressed to come into force on a particular day, shall come into force on the day on which they are so published.

(b) All notifications issued under this Act shall, unless they are expressed to come into force on a particular day, come into force on the day on which they are published.

(3) Every rule made or notification or order issued under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made or issued, be placed on the table of the Legislative Assembly, and if, before the expiry of the session in which it is so placed or the next session, the Assembly makes any modification in any such rule or notification or order, or the Assembly decides that the rule or notification or order should not be made or issued, the rule or notification or order shall thereafter have effect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be, so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule or notification or order.

Validation.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in any judgment, decree or order of any court or other authority, the reservation of sixty-nine per cent made, and anything done or any action taken on the basis of such reservation, by the Government for admissions into educational institutions in the State and for appointments or posts in the services under the State, for the Backward Classes of citizens and for the persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes, during the period commencing on the 16th day of November 1992 and

ending with the date of the publication of this Act in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette*, shall, for all purposes be deemed to be and to have always been, validly made, done or taken in accordance with law, as if this Act had been in force at all material times when such reservation has been made and such thing done, or action taken.

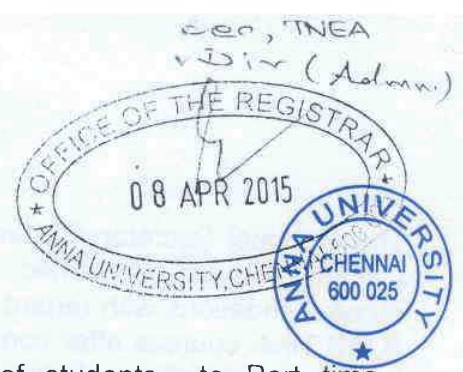
10. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, by an order published in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette*, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as appear to them to be necessary or expedient for removing the difficulty :

Provided that no such order shall be made after the expiry of two years from the date of the publication of this Act in the *Tamil Nadu Government Gazette*.

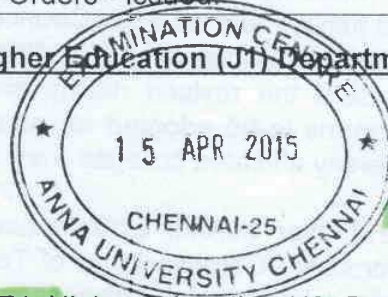

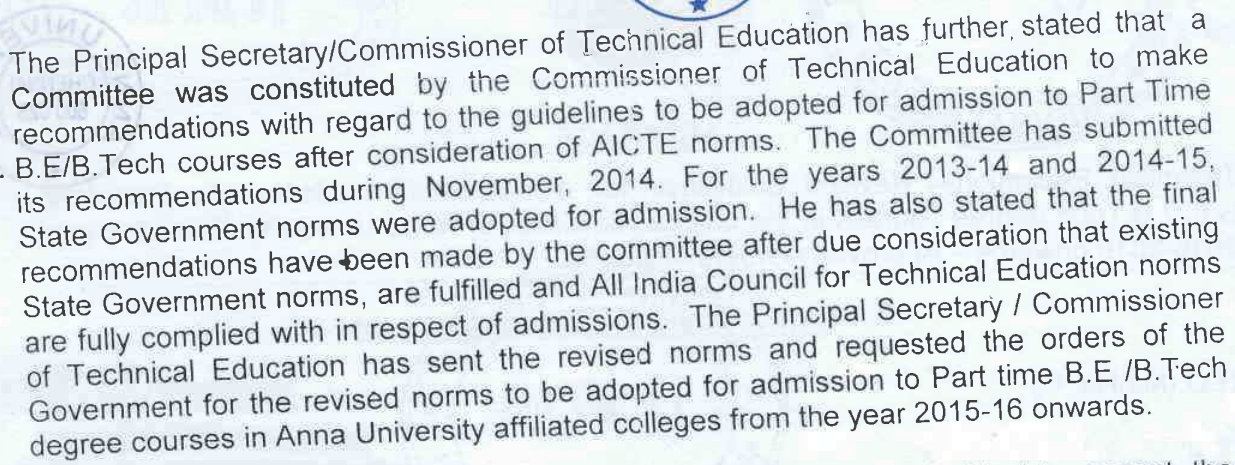
### ORDER:-

In the Government Order first read above, guidelines were issued for admission to Part time B.E / B.Tech courses in Government / Government Aided Engineering Colleges from the academic year 2007-2008 onwards.

2. The Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Technical Education in the letter second read above, has stated that the Part time B.E / B.Tech degree courses (PTBE) are conducted in six Government and three Government Aided Engineering colleges in the State of Tamil Nadu. These programmes were conducted based on Government orders before the All India Council Technical Education Act, 1987 came into force. All India Council Technical Education (AICTE) has started inviting applications for grant of approvals to Part Time courses in the Technical institutions in the State from the year 2012-13 onwards. The norms for admission to part time B.E. courses have been published first time by AICTE in its Approval Process Hand Book 2012-2013 and he has further stated that on scrutiny of norms published by AICTE in its Approval Process Hand Book, it was found that there were some variations in AICTE and existing State Government norms. The major differences are as follows:-

State Government norms issued vide G.O. (Ms)No.74, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated 13.3.2008	AICTE norms published in AICTE Approval Process Hand Book 2012-13
Both working professionals and unemployed candidates are eligible for admission	Only working professionals are eligible for admission
Previous work experience is not necessary	Minimum of two years experience in relevant field is mandatory





3. The Government after careful examination, have decided to accept the proposal of the Principal Secretary / Commissioner of Technical Education. Accordingly, they approve the guidelines for admission to Part time B.E /B.Tech degree courses in the colleges affiliated to Anna University from the academic year 2015-16 onwards annexed to this Government order.

**G.O(MS).No. 63, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated 7.4.2015.**

**Guidelines for admission to Part time B.E /B.Tech degree courses in the colleges affiliated to Anna University from the academic year 2015-16 onwards.**

**(I) General**

- (i) Duration of the Programme:  
The duration of the Programme is 3½ Academic years comprising 7 semesters.
- (ii) Class Hours:  
Classes will be held from 6.15 p.m. to 9.15 p.m on all working days.

**(II) Eligibility Rules**

**(i) Nativity**

Rules in force in respect of Regular Full Time B.E/B.Tech degree courses shall be adopted.

**(ii) Qualifying examination**

A pass in any one of the 3 years Diploma course in appropriate branch of Engineering/Technology of the State Board of Technical Education and Training, Tamil Nadu from an All India Council for Technical Education approved institution or its equivalent.

**(iii) Diploma Mode of study**

The mode of Diploma study shall be Full Time or Lateral Entry or Part Time. Distance mode of study is not permitted.

**(iv) Year of qualifying for Diploma**

- (i) Candidates should have passed the Diploma examination at least two years before the last date prescribed for submission of application.

**(v) Age Limit**

There is no age limit for seeking admission to Part time B.E/B.Tech degree courses

**(vi) Employment**

- (a) Candidates who are working professionals at the time of admission are alone eligible.
- (b) Candidates should have a minimum of two years full time work experience in a registered firm /Company/Industry/Educational and /Government, Autonomous organizations in the relevant field in which admission is sought at the time of admission.





### **(vii) Proof of Employment**

(a) A letter shall be furnished by the employer stating that the candidate is being sponsored to seek admission to the respective course.

(b) Experience certificate issued by other than Government/Quasi Government Department should be accompanied with any one of TNGST /Certificate of Registration/CST certificate /SSI Registration certificate/ Government Approved Contractor Registration Certificate (current year) / Registrar of Companies registration certificate / Certificate of any statutory body

### **(viii) Place of Work**

Distance between the candidate's work place and institution of study shall not exceed 120 KMs

### **(III) Selection Procedure**

#### **(i) Preparation of Merit List**

Merit List should be prepared as per ranking based on the marks obtained by the candidate in the Diploma examination and the marks awarded for the length of service adopting the weightage proportion 75:25 and evaluated for a total of 100 marks.

#### **(ii) Marks for Qualifying examination:**

Marks obtained by the candidate in the qualifying Diploma examination reduced to 75 should be considered for selection as noted below:

(a) Full Time Diploma : Marks obtained by the candidate from 1<sup>st</sup> semester to 6<sup>th</sup> semester of the Diploma examination reduced to 75.

(b) Lateral Entry Diploma : Marks obtained by the candidate from 3<sup>rd</sup> semester to 6<sup>th</sup> semester of the Diploma examination reduced to 75.

(c) Part Time Diploma : Marks obtained by the candidate from 1<sup>st</sup> semester to 8<sup>th</sup> semester of the Diploma examination reduced to 75.

(d) Sandwich Diploma : Marks obtained by the candidate from 1<sup>st</sup> semester to 7<sup>th</sup> semester not intervened by industrial training.

#### **(iii) Marks for experience**

The period of work experience will be calculated from the next day of Practical / Viva Voce of the Diploma examination successfully written by the candidate to the last date prescribed to send the filled in application. Periods of Training/ Apprenticeship will not be considered for the period of experience.

Marks for experience should be calculated for a maximum of 25 marks as follows:

(a) For every completed year of service after passing Diploma 2 Marks

(b) For the period of service less than a year, the marks for experience to be computed as follows:

Below 3 months: 0 mark

3 months and above and below 9 months : 1 mark

9 months and above : 2 marks

#### (IV) Reservation of seats

(i) 3% of the seats are reserved for Differently abled candidates. Guidelines issued in G.O.(Ms)No.98, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated 23.3.2005 shall be adopted for allotment under this category.

(ii) 10% of the seats in Government and Government aided (Aided courses) Engineering Colleges are reserved for Teaching and Non-Teaching staff working on regular appointments in the various Technical institutions (Government, Aided and Self Financing Polytechnic colleges/ Engineering Colleges)

(iii) 10% of the seats in Government Aided Engineering Colleges (Aided courses) are reserved for Management quota.

#### (V) Conduct of Counselling

Counselling shall be conducted to various category of seats in the following order:-

- (i) Allotment against 3% seats reserved for Differently abled candidates.
- (ii) Allotment against 10% Teachers quota
- (iii) Allotment against General category

In respect of each of the above category of seats, candidates shall be called in the order of the respective merit lists and allotments should be made following merit and communal reservation as per norms. Unallotted seats if any, under (i) and (ii) above shall be reverted back to the General category selection.

#### (VI) Communal Reservation

Communal reservation shall be adopted as per rules of reservation of the Government of Tamil Nadu as follows:-

(i) Open competition	.....	31.00%
(ii) BC Muslims	.....	3.50%
(iii) BC	.....	26.50%
(iv) MBC and Denotified Communities	.....	20.00%
(v) Scheduled Castes (Arunthathiyar)	.....	3.00%
(vi) SC	.....	15.00%
(vii) ST	.....	1.00%
Total	.....	100.00%

Common online application form for admission to M.E. / M.Tech. / M.Arch. / M.Plan. degree programmes offered in the University Departments / Constituent Colleges, Government, Government Aided Engineering Colleges and Self-financing Engineering Colleges in Tamil Nadu for the seats surrendered for admission through single window counselling (TANCA 2018).

**1. GENERAL STRUCTURE OF P.G. PROGRAMMES**

Full-Time PG programmes comprise of 4 semesters (2 years) and Part-Time programme comprise of 6 semesters (3 years).

**2. MODE OF STUDY**

**2.1 Full-Time**

Candidates admitted under 'Full-Time' should be available in the departments during working hours for the curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Candidates should not attend any other Full-Time Programme(s) / Course(s) or take up any Full-Time Job / Part-Time Job in any institution or company during the period of the programme.

**Violation of the above rules will result in termination from programme.**

**2.2 Part-Time**

Part-Time candidates will not be permitted to convert to Full-Time Mode during the course of study.

**3. CATEGORY OF INSTITUTIONS**

The Government of Tamil Nadu in G.O. (2D) No. 69, Higher Education (J2) Department, dated **06.11.2017** have nominated Anna University, Chennai-25 as its nodal agency for the conduct of Tamil Nadu Common Admissions (**TANCA**) through single window counselling for M.E. / M.Tech. / M.Arch. / M.Plan. degree programmes offered at

- (i) University Departments / Regional Campuses of Anna University / University Colleges.
- (ii) Government and Government Aided Engineering Colleges
- (iii) Self-financing Engineering Colleges ( for the seats surrendered by them for the single window counselling)

**4. ELIGIBILITY**

**(A)** Candidates who have passed all the subjects in the recognised Bachelor's Degree or equivalent field and obtained at least 50 % (45 % in the case of candidates belonging to reserved categories) in the qualifying degree examination as per AICTE norms are eligible.

Further, the candidates shall possess

- i) T A N C E T 2018 mark

(or)

- ii) GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 qualified score in the appropriate discipline of Engineering / Technology

(or)

- iii) GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 qualified score in Engineering Science (X E) and Life Science (X L) papers along with T A N C E T 2018 mark.

**Note 1:** Eligibility qualifications for admission to various programmes are given in **Annexure I**.

**Note 2:** A candidate is considered GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 qualified, if the marks secured are greater than or equal to the qualifying marks mentioned respectively for the category in the GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 score card.

**Note 3:** If a candidate claims that the educational qualification possessed by him / her (though not the same as prescribed eligible qualification) is equivalent to the eligible qualification prescribed in **Annexure I**, he / she should obtain the Equivalency Certificate from the Director, Academic Courses, Anna University, Chennai on or before the last date prescribed for registration of the online application. However, the claim would be subject to the decision of the admitting authority.

**(B)** Candidates of the following categories may also apply for admission:

- (i) Candidates appeared for the final semester / year examination of the qualifying degree programmes during April / May 2018, **except A.M.I.E.** The candidates should produce an evidence of having passed all the subjects in the qualifying degree examination at the time of counselling, failing which the candidates will not be permitted to attend the counselling. Copy of results downloaded from internet is permitted only when it is attested by the Principal.
- (ii) *Candidates with Section 'A' & 'B' certificates (e.g. A.M.I.E.) of the Institution of Engineers and other similar certificates of various professional bodies viz., Aeronautical Society of India etc., recognised by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India and enrolled before 31.5.2013 are considered to be equivalent to B.E./ B.Tech degree holders for admission to M.E./ M.Tech. degree programmes subject to the following conditions (a), (b) & (c)*
  - a) *Candidates should have studied 10 + 2 years Higher Secondary. + AMIE (with 2 years experience) (or) 10 + 3 Years diploma (awarded by the State Board of Technical Education) + AMIE (with 2 years experience)*
  - b) *Two years regular full time Teaching experience / Industrial experience in the relevant field after passing all the subjects including project work. The experience certificate will have to be produced by the candidate.*
  - c) *Must have qualified either in GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 with qualifying score or TANCET 2018.*

**The following categories of candidates are not eligible**

- (i) *Candidates admitted through **Lateral Entry** in degree courses except **B.E / B.Tech.***
- (ii) *Candidates with B.E. / B.Tech degrees obtained through **Distance Mode/Week End** courses.*
- (iii) *Candidates with degree obtained without studying **10th Std, 12th Std. or 3 years diploma and 3/4 years degree programme.***

**5. NATIVITY**

Candidates who have studied continuously for the last 5 years (from XII Standard onwards) in Tamil Nadu will be considered as Tamil Nadu candidates.

Candidates who are Native of Tamil Nadu but have studied XII or/ and Diploma, Degree outside Tamil Nadu have to upload a photo copy of Nativity Certificate. The Nativity certificate in **electronic form / digitally signed e-Certificate** only will be accepted.

**6. COMMUNAL RESERVATION**

- a) Candidates belonging to Other States are eligible in **Open Competition category** only.
- b) Candidates who are Sri Lankan Refugees and passed the recognised qualifying degree (with a minimum of 50 % marks) in Tamil Nadu will be considered for admission to M.E /



M.Tech. / M.Arch. / M.Plan. degree programmes as per rank, under Open Competition through Single Window Counselling. Sri Lankan Refugee candidates should upload a copy of the identification certificate obtained from the Head Quarters Tahsildars and those who have not registered in Refugee's Camps should upload a copy of visa, passport and letter registered in Police Station. Candidates must have also appeared for **TANCET 2018**.

- c) Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered under BC / BCM / MBC & DNC / SC / SCA / ST categories. List of communities is given in Annexure – II.

## **7.3 Sponsored Category (Admission only in University Departments of Anna University, Chennai – 25).**

### **7.3.1 Admission**

- A limited number of seats (Full-Time mode) are available for the candidates employed and sponsored by the Government / Government Organisations / Government Aided Educational Institutions under sponsored category in the University Departments of Anna University, Chennai i.e. (College of Engineering Guindy, A.C. College of Technology, School of Architecture & Planning and Madras Institute of Technology Campuses).
- Sponsored Registered Professional Architects with a minimum of five years of professional experience will be considered for admission to M.Arch. degree programme under Sponsored Category at University Department, School of Architecture & Planning, Anna University, Chennai - 25.
- All the candidates under sponsored category should have appeared in TANCET 2018.
- It is a full time programme.

### **7.3.2 Criteria**

The candidates admitted under sponsored category in the University Departments of Anna University, Chennai shall satisfy the conditions given below:

Candidates shall

- *Be deputed with **full pay and allowances** during the period of study.*
- *Have obtained **at least 50 % marks** in aggregate in the qualifying degree examination.*
- *Have a minimum of **two years of full time experience** in the relevant field of the programme to which admission is sought after passing the qualifying degree.*

### 7.3.3 How to apply:

The candidates who intend to apply for seats under sponsored category should

- have appeared in TANCET 2018.
- apply through Online in the web portal [www.annauniv.edu/tanca2018](http://www.annauniv.edu/tanca2018).
- take a print out of the filled – in online application.

## 8. STIPEND

GATE qualified candidates admitted under GATE ( Engg / Technology) (or) (Engineering Science- X E / Life Science- X L) category (other than those deputed / sponsored) shall be eligible for stipend funded by the Ministry of Human Resource Development ( M H R D ), Govt of India, provided the marks secured are more than or equal to the qualifying marks in the category under which the candidate is admitted.

**Note:** Tamil Nadu native candidates alone will be considered under BC / BCM / MBC & DNC / SC / SCA / ST categories.

## 9. MERIT LIST PREPARATION

### 9.1 GATE category

- **GATE (Engineering / Technology):** The merit list will be prepared based on GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 **SCORE** in the appropriate discipline of Engineering / Technology.
- **GATE (Engineering Sciences ( X E ) / Life Sciences ( X L ) category:** The merit list will be prepared based on GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 **SCORE** in Engineering Science (XE) and Life Science ( X L ) papers and TANCET 2018 **MARK** with a weightage of 70:30.  
A common merit list will be prepared for GATE (Engineering / Technology) and GATE (Engineering Sciences ( X E ) / Life Sciences ( X L ) category

### 9.2 TANCET category

The merit list will be prepared based on the marks obtained in TANCET 2018.

### 9.3 Sponsored category (Admission only in University Departments of Anna University, Chennai-25)

The merit list will be prepared based on the marks obtained in TANCET 2018.

**Inter-se-merit:** When more than one candidate had obtained the same marks in TANCET – 2018, the candidate having higher average percentage of marks obtained in the qualifying degree examination will be placed in higher rank in the merit list.

The merit list will be published in Anna University web portal.

- 10.2** Candidates seeking admission under ST/ SC / SCA / MBC & DNC/ BC / BCM quota should obtain the certificate of social status issued by the competent authority in the Permanent Community Card ( P C C ) format or Electronic Form ( E F ) / Digitally Signed e - Certificate prescribed by the Govt. of Tamil Nadu and upload a photocopy of the same along with the online application.

The P C C format or E F / Digitally signed e - Certificate shall be obtained from the authorities given below on or before the last date prescribed for registration of online application.

- 10.3** Community Certificate ( C C ) not obtained from Tamil Nadu will not be considered for communal reservation.
- 10.4** For communities linked with districts (Refer **Annexure II** of the information and instructions to candidates), the candidates should obtain their **C C** in their respective district. **C C** obtained from other than their respective district will not be considered. However, candidates who belong to **BC, MBC & DNC** communities in a particular district and migrated to other places in Tamil Nadu and obtained **C C** from competent authorities in the migrated district on or after 28.10.2009, will be considered. (*as per G.O. (St) No.95 BC, MBC & Minorities Welfare Department, dated 28.10.2009*).



- 10.5** Candidates who have not uploaded a copy of the Permanent Community Certificate or Electronic Form / digitally signed e-Certificate at the time of registration of the application will be considered under **Open Competition (O C) Category**. In the event of such a decision, the eligibility conditions and rules prescribed for OC category will be applicable for such candidates and if such candidates do not satisfy the rules of "OC Category", their applications are liable to be rejected.

## **11. SPECIAL RESERVATION**

### **11.1 Special Categories**

The special reservation categories and the quota for these categories are given in the Table. Since the special reservation applications are processed by separate committees, candidates should also pay Rs. 100/- for each special reservation category at the time of Registration. Candidates are instructed to produce appropriate certificates and supporting documents for special reservation claim at the time of Original Certificates Verification at TFCs. If appropriate certificates and documents are not produced, their claim under such categories will not be considered.

**Only Tamil Nadu Native candidates are eligible for Special reservation.**

**(i)** Candidates claiming admission against the reservation of seats under Son's / Daughter's of Ex-Servicemen Category (Sl. No. 1) should produce the certificate in the format (Certificate No. III) from an officer of the Department of Ex-servicemen's Welfare of Tamil Nadu not below the rank of Assistant Director of Ex-servicemen's Welfare of the district in which the dependent is a native. **Candidates called for Certificates Verification should also produce discharge certificates and Ex-Servicemen ID card of their parent.**

**(ii)** Candidates seeking admission against reservation set apart for Visually Impaired, Hearing impaired (Deaf), orthopaedically Differently Abled Persons, Autism, Multiple disabilities (Sl. Nos. 2a to 2e) should produce the certificate from the **Medical Board (minimum 3 doctors) of the District** concerned certifying the nature and **extent of disability in percentage** and with regard to his/her suitability for admission to Engineering Colleges specifically mentioned under 5.2 and in the format (Certificate No. IV/V/VI/VII/VIII). Certificates obtained from an **individual Doctor** will not be considered. **Further, a separate medical Board for each category will examine the candidates with reference to their certificates, at the time of Original Certificates Verification at TFC.**

(iii) Candidates seeking admission against special reservation of seats under Eminent Sports Persons (Sl. No. 3) should produce their original sports certificates along with appropriate forms as given in Annexure II at the time of Original Certificates Verification at TFC at Anna University Campus-Chennai only.

(iv) Candidates seeking admission against seats under Special reservation categories (Sl. No. 1 to 3) **should also satisfy the eligibility rules mentioned in item No. 3.** The candidates are also eligible for admission **under general counselling.**

## **11.2 Eligibility criteria for various disabilities**

### **A. Norms for Visual Impairment (Certificate No. I)**

1. **"Blindness"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—

- (i) total absence of sight; or
- (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
- (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.

2. **"Low-vision"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, namely:—

- (i) visual acuity not exceeding 6/18 or less than 20/60 up to 3/60 or up to 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible corrections; or
- (ii) limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 40 degree up to 10 degree.

### **B. Norms for Hearing Impairment (Certificate No. II)**

1. **"Deaf"** means persons having 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

2. **"Hard of hearing"** means person having 60 DB to 70 DB hearing loss in speech frequencies in both ears.

### **C. Norms for Locomotor Disability (Certificate No. III)**

1. **Locomotor disability** (a person's inability to execute distinctive activities associated with movement of self and objects resulting from affliction of musculoskeletal or nervous system or both), including—

2. **"Leprosy cured person"** means a person who has been cured of leprosy but is suffering from—

- (i) loss of sensation in hands or feet as well as loss of sensation and paresis in the eye and eye-lid but with no manifest deformity;
- (ii) manifest deformity and paresis but having sufficient mobility in their hands and feet to enable them to engage in normal economic activity;
- (iii) extreme physical deformity as well as advanced age which prevents him/her from undertaking any gainful occupation, and the expression "leprosy cured" shall be construed accordingly;

3. **"Cerebral palsy"** means a Group of non-progressive neurological condition affecting body movements and muscle coordination, caused by damage to one or more specific areas of the brain, usually occurring before, during or shortly after birth;

4. **"Dwarfism"** means a medical or genetic condition resulting in an adult height of 4 feet 10 inches (147 centimeters) or less;

5. **"Muscular dystrophy"** means a group of hereditary genetic muscle disease that weakens the muscles that move the human body and persons with multiple dystrophy have incorrect and missing information in their genes, which prevents them from making the proteins they need for healthy muscles. It is characterised by progressive skeletal muscle weakness, defects in muscle proteins, and the death of muscle cells and tissue;

6. **"Acid attack victims"** means a person disfigured due to violent assaults by throwing of acid or similar corrosive substance.

### **D. Norms for Autism, Intellectual Disability, Specific Learning Disability and Mental Illness (Certificate No. IV)**

1. **"Speech and language disability"** means a permanent disability arising out of conditions such as laryngectomy or aphasia affecting one or more components of speech and language due to organic or neurological causes.

2. **Intellectual disability**, a condition characterized by significant limitation both in intellectual functioning (reasoning, learning, problem solving) and in adaptive behaviour which covers a range of every day, social and practical skills, including—

- (i) **"specific learning disabilities"** means a heterogeneous group of conditions wherein there is a deficit in processing language, spoken or written, that may manifest itself as a difficulty to comprehend, speak, read,

write, spell, or to do mathematical calculations and includes such conditions as perceptual disabilities, dyslexia, dysgraphia, dyscalculia, dyspraxia and developmental aphasia;

- (ii) **"autism spectrum disorder"** means a neuro-developmental condition typically appearing in the first three years of life that significantly affects a person's ability to communicate, understand relationships and relate to others, and is frequently associated with unusual or stereotypical rituals or behaviours.

**3. Mental behaviour** — "mental illness" means a substantial disorder of thinking, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, capacity to recognize reality or ability to meet the ordinary demands of life, but does not include retardation which is a condition of arrested or incomplete development of mind of a person, specially characterized by sub normality of intelligence.

**4. Disability caused due to—**

- (i) chronic neurological conditions, such as—

(a) **"multiple sclerosis"** means an inflammatory, nervous system disease in which the myelin sheaths around the axons of nerve cells of the brain and spinal cord are damaged, leading to demyelization and affecting the ability of nerve cells in the brain and spinal cord to communicate with each other;

(b) **"Parkinson's disease"** means a progressive disease of the nervous system marked by tremor, muscular rigidity, and slow, imprecise movement, chiefly affecting middle-aged and elderly people associated with degeneration of the basal ganglia of the brain and a deficiency of the neurotransmitter dopamine.

- (ii) Blood disorder—

(a) **"hemophilia"** means an inheritable disease, usually affecting only male but transmitted by women to their male children, characterized by loss or impairment of the normal clotting ability of blood so that a minor wound may result in fatal bleeding;

(b) **"Thalassemia"** means a group of inherited disorders characterized by reduced or absent amounts of hemoglobin.

(c) **"sickle cell disease"** means a hemolytic disorder characterized by chronic anemia, painful events, and various complications due to associated tissue and organ damage; "hemolytic" refers to the destruction of the cell membrane of red blood cells resulting in the release of hemoglobin.

**E. Norms for Multiple Disabilities (Certificate No. V)**

Multiple Disabilities (more than one of the above specified disabilities) including deaf blindness which means a condition in which a person may have combination of hearing and visual impairments causing severe communication, developmental, and educational problems.

**12. COUNSELLING**

- 12.1** Seats will be allotted through counselling only. **More number of candidates than the actual number of seats available will be called for counselling.** Candidates are advised to check the seats available in the webportal [www.annauniv.edu/tanca2018](http://www.annauniv.edu/tanca2018). Admission will be offered depending upon the seats available based on the merit of the candidates who attend counselling as per the reservation norms of Government of Tamil Nadu and others cannot claim any right for admission. A candidate can get allotment for one programme only.

**Note :** The availability of number of seats/courses/branches hosted in the Anna University webportal is subject to change before the counselling.

- 12.2** GATE category candidates must appear for counselling with GATE 2016 / 2017 / 2018 score card. Unfilled seats if any, under GATE category will be converted to Non-GATE category in the respective communities.

- Candidates who have passed all the subjects of the qualifying degree with a minimum of 50 % marks for General category and 45 % marks for reserved categories (BC / BCM / MBC&DNC / SC / SCA / ST candidates belonging to Tamil Nadu) in the qualifying examination alone will be permitted to attend counselling.
- The counselling schedule and the format of "Intimation of Counselling" containing details about counselling will be published in Anna University webportal <http://www.annauniv.edu/tanca2018> before the commencement of counselling. Candidates should download the Call Letter, only in Anna University webportal by entering their TANCA

application number, Name and Date of Birth.

- **Eligible candidates may appear for counselling according to their cut-off mark and they should report two hours before the counselling session irrespective of receipt of individual communication. Candidates who do not attend the counselling have to forego the claim of admission.**
- Counselling will be held at Anna University, Chennai – 25. Candidates should attend the counselling at their own cost with all the original certificates. If a candidate has deposited all the certificates where he/she has already been admitted, a letter from the head of the institution should be produced to that effect. In such cases only, attested photocopies of certificates will be accepted. **However, the original allotment order will be withheld** and it will be given after verifying the original certificates.

Change of date / time of counselling is not permissible. Authorities are not responsible for the postal delay or non-receipt of counselling intimation.

At the time of counselling, the candidates have to pay ₹ **5,300/-** (₹ **1,150/-** for **SC / SCA / ST** candidates belonging to Tamil Nadu) in the form of a Demand Draft or Cash, which includes a non-refundable fee of ₹ **300/-** towards counselling fee (₹ **150/-** for **SC/SCA/ST** candidates belonging to Tamil Nadu) and attend the counselling with all the original certificates. The Demand Draft should be drawn in favour of **"The Secretary, TANCA, Anna University"** payable at **Chennai**.

Due to unforeseen and unavoidable reasons, if a candidate is unable to attend the counselling on the specified date and time he/she can

1. Authorise his/her parent on his/her behalf and the parent's decision will be binding on the candidate. An authorisation letter given by the candidate should be submitted by the parents. Parents should also produce a photo identity of any one, voter ID, driving license, PAN card and passport.
2. Attend on a subsequent time/date, during the counselling period. But the candidate can only opt for the seats available at the time of attending the counselling and cannot claim seat as per the rank.

Once a seat is allotted, the amount of ₹ **5,000/-** for general or ₹ **1,000/-** for **SC/SCA/ST** candidates already paid at the time of counselling will be adjusted towards the tuition fee to be paid to the respective allotted college.

## **9. Refund of Initial Deposit**

**One allotted a seat**, the amount ₹ 5000/- (₹ 1000/- in the case of SC/SCA/ST candidates belonging to Tamilnadu) already paid at the time of counselling will be adjusted in the tuition fee. If a candidate does not join after allotment and seeks refund, only 80% of the initial amount paid at the time of counselling will be refunded. In such cases original allotment order with acknowledgment for the receipt of payment should be surrendered on or before 31.12.2018. The refund will be processed only through TANCA 2018 refund processing system available online in TANCA webportal. All admissions made through single window system are provisional.

Counselling and admitting authorities reserve the right to accept or reject any application without assigning any reason.

**College / Branch once allotted will not be changed under any circumstances.**

In the G.O. (st) No. 6 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 09.01.2012, G.O. (st) No. 92 Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare (AD3) Department dated 11.09.2012 and G.O. (st) No. 16 Adi Dravidar and Tribal welfare (AD3) Department dated 24.02.2014, the Government have ordered to grant Post Matric scholarship to SC/SCA/ST candidates, whose parental annual income not exceeding ₹ 2,50,000/- and for SC/SCA converted Christians annual income not exceeding ₹ 2,00,000/- from all the sources shall only be eligible. ## **As per – The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016**

### **Visual Impairment:**

**"Blindness"** means a condition where a person has any of the following conditions, after best correction—

- (i) total absence of sight; or
- (ii) visual acuity less than 3/60 or less than 10/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with best possible correction; or
- (ii) the field of vision subtending an angle of less than 10 degree.
