INTRODUCTION:



- In that event most of our cadets were selected for performing Guard Of Honour.





Introduction:

Thalir, an event under CADEFESTA, a part of inter college colligate NCC competition, aims at implanting fidelity in the minds of the cadets about the sprouting environmental and societal issues. The theme that was undertaken by the cadets of JEC NCC for this event was to create awareness on "Environmental Issues".

Farm management is essential because of the sufficient air circulation encouraged by tight spacing and constant irrigation. Furthermore, high humidity provides optimal conditions for reproduction of many fungal and bacterial pathogens. When farm management is neglected, pathogen populations build up and continue to increase as long as there is susceptible plant tissue available for infection and disease development. Infected plant tissue, infested soil, and pathogen inoculum all serve as sources of pathogens that can later infect healthy plants. Removal of any material that can harbor pathogens is the basis for disease management using sanitation practices. This prevents spread of pathogens to healthy plants or reduces survival from one cropping cycle to another.

About the Event:

The event was scheduled on 30th December 2021 and it took place in the farm established by green projects. The cadets assemble around 0620 hours and the event started at 0700 hours. The event started as soon as the invigilating cadets came from the Ambedkar law university (TNDALU). We started the event

MORNING PT:

Physical exercise can improve brain health, help manage weight, reduce the risk of disease, strengthen bones and muscles, and improve ability to do everyday activities. In INS Shivaji every day on 0545 hours all cadets mustered for morning pt. Then we all are done a warm-up, running and workouts.







PARADE:

Parade improve the unity between the cadets, improve concentration, discipline and smartness. "Drill is the bedrock of discipline". We Mustered at 0830 hours in first three days and then we done a parade in parade ground. In parade ground we done marching and turning comments.













CMET TRAINING PART-1

The Centre of Marine Engineering Technology (CMET) is the largest training department of the establishment and is entrusted with professional training of Marine Engineer Officers and Sailors of the Indian Navy, Indian Coast Guard and friendly foreign Navies.

On 01.06.2022 we went to CMET part 1. There they explained about various types of engines used in naval ships. We learned about the process and working of diesel engine and gas turbines. Then we were taken to show about boilers engines in a ship and were explained about it's working and was lucky to see a working model of the boiler engine. They arranged boiler machine with the simplest arrangement of the internal parts. The main job of a boiler is to makehigh pressure steam. The feed water supplied to the boiler drum utilizes the heat of the energy released by burning the fuel. This energy of the burning fuel is stored in the form of steam with high temperature and pressure. The fuel is burnt in a combustion chamber inside the boiler. To attain high efficiency and complete combustion, air is supplied to this combustion chamber through aseparate arrangement. The heat generated in this combustion chamber is transferred to the water from the boiler drum through a large surface area, which enables the highest rate of energy transfer.

To increase the efficiency of the boiler, the feed water that enters the boiler is preheated with the help of an economizer through which the feed water passes before entering the boiler. The exhaust gas of the boiler is also put to use by making it pass over an air heater, which heats up the combustion air entering the furnace. Thus, even the energy exhausted from the boiler is not allowed to go waste, which increases the overall efficiency of the system.









CMET TRAINING PART-2

On 02.06.2022 we went to CMET part 2 there explained about industrial training, fabrication, fitting shop, mechanic Shop and welding shop. In Fabrication the manipulation of raw materials (such as steel) to make machines and structures. Fitting Shop involves a large number of hand operations to finish the work to desired shape, size and accuracy. Welding is joining of two or more pieces of metal by applying heat, through various means, to produce a localized union through fusion across the interface.





SMALL ARMS TRAINING:

On 01.06.2022 we went to small arm training. There JEC cadets NC I Madhesh and NC I Hariharan explained about the working and parts of 0.22 rifles and 5.56 INSAS. They done a demo of kholna jodna. They allowed some cadets to do kholna jodna. There we learned many things about rifles.





MUSEUM:

We visited museum on 03.06.2022. It is the one of the largest naval museum in Asia. The purpose of the museum remains to protect and promote the interests of Naval Marine Engineers. There we saw many historical things and we saw about history of navy. Then we went to motivational hall. There we saw about the great warriors in navy.











WATERMANSHIP TRAINING PART1:

Watermanship Training Centre (WTC) which caters for training requirements as well as recreational sailing and watermanship activities. We visited WTC on 03.06.2022. There they told about 2 types of boats sail boats and motor boats and then showed a 2 sails boat and explained how it can be sailed by 1 person or with 2 person and explained the functions and significance of each parts.





WATERMANSHIP TRAINING PART 2:

On 06.06.2022 we went again to WTC. There they taught us how to ride in kayaking and pedal boats. Then we all went for ride with guidance of trainers and with life jacket. Each were given approximately 5 minutes on either thekayak or pedal boat.





MOTIVATIONAL MOVIE:

On 04.06.2022 we went to see motivational movie "Shershah". It was a great movie. We saw about the captain Vikram Batra in that movie. In this movie we saw about the victory of India in Kargil war.





NBCD SCHOOL VISIT:

The NBCD School conducts training in nuclear, biological and chemical aspects, damage control and fire-fighting. It has a world class damage control simulator namely Akshat. We visited NBCD school for 2 days on 06.06.2022 and 07.06.2022. In first day we seen about fire extinguisher and BASCCA suit in FFTF (Fire Fighting Training Facility). They showed as a live burn of helicopter.Next day in FFTF they shown as a live firing in engine room. They allowed somecadets to wear BASCCA suit. Then they taught us to use fire extinguisher and welearned to refill it. Then they allow some cadets to fight against fire with fire extinguisher.









Then we visited the biochemical site where they had a radio emitting cobal source and build for trainees to give a stimulus experience of real life event. There they shown as a nuclear radiation detector. Then they briefly explained of a nuclear Attack and various explosion zones and how to save ourself in each zones and were told the difference between alpha, beta particles and gamma rays and how to protect our self from them or decrease their effects on our body, and how it is used in a ship and how to save our self.







Then we went to ship repairs and damage control. The instructor explained how various tools can be used for various situations and how each are different from the others. He later went on to explain the different programs they offer to the upcoming sailors to do, so as they are well prepared and ready when they are sent to the see. The best experience in that was that we were given the chance to experience the damage control stimulation were the ships were flooded with water and lateral altitudes were shifted 20 degrees.







NDA VISIT:

The National Defence Academy is the joint defence service training institute of the Indian Armed Forces, where cadets of the three services i.e. the Indian Army, the Indian Navy and the Indian Air Force train together before they go on to respective service academy for further pre-commission training. we visited NDA on 05.06.2022. There we first went to watch a video about NDA. Then we visit gallery and medal section there saw historical photos and war medals of our nation. Then we went to Cadet's Mess ,it is one place helps develop the sense of solidarity among the cadets. When all of them have food together, they end up sharing many a special moment together. The Mess can house over 2100 cadets.











VISIT TO WAR MEMORIAL:

The National War Memorial Southern Command is a war memorial in the city of Pune, India, dedicated to post-Independence war martyrs. This is the only war memorial in South Asia which has been erected by citizens' contributions

The memorial was unveiled and dedicated to the nation on 15th August 1998. A MiG-23BN, used in the Kargil War, is on display at the memorial. A replica of the now decommissioned frigate INS Trishul, which served in the Liberation of Goa and the Indo-Pakistani War of 1971, is also on display.





SPORTS:

Sports teach teamwork and problem-solving skills. Fighting for a common goal with a group of players and coaches teaches you how to build teamwork. In INS Shivaji every day 1645 hours we went to play sports - volleyball, basketball and football.





ENDING CEREMONY:

The camp conclude with ending ceremony. They shown as a video about Indian Navy and INS Shivaji. Then base commander pawan kumar came there and give a motivational speech about India navy. There, they explained briefly about how to join indian army. Then we take group photo.





OUTING IN INS SHIVAJI:

On 08.06.2022 we went to outing in INS Shivaji. We wear INS Shivaji T-Shirt and we walked around the INS Shivaji base and visited various places. Then we take group photo. Then we went to tiger point in Lonavala.

We attend Naval Sea Attachment Camp at kochi in INS MAGAR from July 4 to July 13 .INS Magar is the lead ship of Magarclass amphibious warfare vessels of the Indian Navy. She was built by Garden Reach Shipbuilders and Engineers, Kolkataand was commissioned by Admiral R.H. Tahiliani, Chief of the Naval Staff on 15 July 1987. The ship has a length of 120 metres and a beam of

17.5 metres. The main weapon systems of the ship consist of CRN 91 Guns, chaff launcher (Kavach) and the WM-18A Rocket launcher. The ship also carries four landing craft vehicle personnel (LCVP) on boardwhich can be used for the landing of troops.
