
INTERNET OF THINGS ()

JPR ROTARACT club laid the first stone on 29 FEBRUARY, 2016. It is a service, leadership, professional and community service organization for young men and women. Rotaract focuses on the development of young adults as leaders in their communities and workplaces. Clubs around the world also take part in international service projects, in a global effort to bring peace and international understanding to the world.

Changes are not only possible and predictable, but to deny them is to be an accomplice to one's own unnecessary vegetation. Our college rotaract club has initiated a "GO GREEN PROJECT" to impart the necessity of green environment and terrace vegetation. The project commenced on 5 JANUARY, 2016.

Terrace garden is new trend for having surrounded by nature. Terrace garden not only gives rich look to the house but it is also helpful in providing good health. Our students are split into various teams and each team is assigned a specific Rotrarion. Terrace vegetation is imparted in all rotrarions houses. 12 students are assigned to this project from IT department. This project summoned up that Vegetation is the basic instrument the creator uses to set all of nature in motion.

The students are set to visit the rotrarions house weekly once to monitor the growth of saplings till it gets harvested. After one crop has grown and harvested, another plant can be planted in its place. This works better in places with a long growing season, but even with a shorter season, lettuce planted in spring is often done in time to plant another batch.

Nature is man's best friend. It is only in the lap of nature one can forget all the worldly worries. Nature has the power to provide that comfort and peace which one requires. This project continues for about 16 weeks.

PONGAL

Pongal is a harvest festival, thanking the sun god for agricultural abundance. Thai Pongal is a four-day festival which according to Tamil Calendar is normally celebrated from January 14th. This corresponds to the last day of Tamil month Maargazhi. The origin of pongal festival may date to more than 5000 years ago.



Epigraphic evidence suggests the celebration of the puthiyeedu during the medieval Chola empire days. In India every state celebrate in different names, Tamil people refer to Pongal as "Tamizhar Thirunaal", the festival of Tamils. The day marks the start of the sun's six-month-long journey northwards (uttaraayanam). This also corresponds to the indic solstice when the sun purportedly enters the 10th house of the Indian zodiac makara or Capricorn.

Part of the celebration is the boiling of the first rice of the season consecrated to the sun. The preceding Pongal is called Bhogi. On this day people discard old belongings and celebrate new possessions. The disposal of wornout items is similar to the traditions of holika in north India. people assemble at dawn in Tamil Nadu to light a bonfire in order to burn the discards. Houses are cleaned, painted and decorated to give a festive look. The horns of oxen and buffaloes are painted in villages.

In Tamil Nadu farmers keep medicinal herb in northeast corner of each fields, to prevent crops from diseases and pests. The main event, also known as thai pongal, takes place on the second of the four days. This day coincides with the makara sankranthi, a winter harvest festival celebrated throughout India. During the festival, milk is cooked a vessel. When it starts in bubble and overflows out of vessel, freshly harvested rice grains are added to the pot. At the same time other participants blow a conch.





They also recite "thai pirandhal pirakkum" vazhi of (the commencement opportunities). The pongal is then served to everyone in the house along with savories and sweets. Tamilians decorate their homes with banana and mango leaves and floor embellish the with decorative patterns drawn using rice flour. Family elders present gifts to the young. The sun stands for "pratyasksha brahman" - the manifest god who symbolizes the one, non dual, self-effulgent, glorious divinity blessing one and all tirelessly.

The sun is the who one transcends time and also the one who rotates the proverbial wheel of time. Maatu pongal is celebrated the day after pongal. Tamil regard cattle as sources of wealth for providing dairv products, fertilizer, and labor of plowingand transportation.

pongal, cattle are On maatu recognized and afforded affectionately. Features of the day include gaming events such as the taming iallikattu and Kanu pidi is a tradition for women and young girls. During this, women feed birds and pray for their brothers well being. As part of the celebration, women and girls place a feast of colored rice, cooked vegetables, and sweet banana pongal.

On this day celebrants bathe and decorate their cattle with garlands. Cows are decorated with turmeric water and oil. One ritual is to light a torch of coconut leaves and carry it around cattle three times and then run to the border of the village to drop it.

This is believed to remove the evil influences caused the bv jealousy of the other people over the cattle. Kannum Pongal, fourth day of the festival, marks the end of pongal festivities for the year. The word "kaanum" in this context means "to visit". Many families hold reunions on this day. Brothers pay special tribute to their married sisters by giving affirmation of their gifts as filial love. Landlords gifts of food, clothes and money to tenants. Villagers their relatives and friends while the city people flock to beaches and theme parks with their families. Thus this harvest festival celebrated worldwide by Tamilians.





Republic Day is celebrated in India on 26th day of January every year.

India became an Independent Nation on 15th August, 1947. On 26th January, 1950 India was formerly declared Republic. In Republic, the supreme power is held not by a monarch, but by the elected representatives of the people, along with an elected President. So this day is celebrated as the Republic Day. It is a National holiday.

Jeppiar celebrates this special day, attended by its important quests grandly.




26 JANUARY INDIA REPUBLIC DAY
